INTRODUCTION


The articles and artwork in this booklet have been written by Alateen members and taken from past issues of *ALATEEN TALK*. By expressing their views, Alateen members show there are many ways to improve our conscious contact with the God of our understanding.

Most of us come into Alateen feeling lonely, confused, and frightened. We wonder why we have been given such a rotten break in life. A few of us still have a strong belief but many of us question if there is a God, or blame God for our problems, or we stop believing in a God altogether. Through the gentle guidance of the Alateen program, we begin to trust and believe in *something*. For some of us, it might be the Alateen group. For others it is a belief in something bigger than ourselves—knowing we have the freedom to develop our own concept of what that something might be. Once we reach this point, the feeling of loneliness can lessen and our problems don't seem so severe. Many of us experience a "spiritual awakening" when we come to believe there is a Higher Power to help us.

At the end of this booklet, there are ten questions to help with the idea of a HIGHER POWER. We can use them for our personal recovery, and as a topic for an Alateen meeting.




Before Alateen I resented my lot in life and thought I was the only one asking, "Why me?"

I've learned to love and respect myself. Most of all, I know that I'm important and that people will be there when I need them.


