

Some people prepare for a power outage during a storm.




Prepper Pete thought that was a great idea, so he bought some candles, flashlights...

Those can mess things up really bad, so Prepper Pete bought some tools, extra food, and water.




**He also made a safe shelter in

Such an event could cause all electronics to stop working.


Certain types of war would also cause a similar event, so Pete started learning to use tools that didn't require electricity.

didn't want to take that chance.**


He knew that not everyone was prepared. Those who didn't have anything might become desperate and try to take things from others.






**So Prepper Pete decided

A NOTE FOR GROWNUPS!




PREPPER PETE'S GUN OF A SON
